- providing dedicated space for issues and research around COVID-19 which will also support existing networks and areas of activity for SRHE
- a life-limited (two-year) Network, activity and impact reviewed in 2025
- audience: national and international; academics at any career stage including doctoral study;
   professional and managerial staff in higher education.

## **NETWORK AIMS**

- to bring together researchers and practitioners from a range of theoretical, disciplinary and national backgrounds engaged in critical studies of the experience, impact and longer-term implications of the COVID-19 pandemic on the global higher education sector.
- to convene up to 3 events each academic year including the SRHE Annual Research Conference
- to provide a forum for engagement with an emerging literature on HE and the pandemic,
   addressing issues relating to staff, students and institutions
- to facilitate the presentation and discussion of new research into the experiences, impacts and longer-term implications of the COVID-19 pandemic on the HE sector
- to engage with other SRHE Networks and external SIGs in applying pandemic-related research to a wide range of topics within the sector
